Centennial Park Pathway Planning

Centennial Park (5572 Dr. Leach Drive) is Manotick's primary active recreational park and community gathering place. This 7 hectare (17+ acres) park is a backdrop to the Mike O'Neil Arena and Manotick Community Centre and includes a variety of sports fields and facilities.

Under the Government of Canada's Active Transportation Fund (ATF), MCPRA received a planning grant to examine enhancements and extensions to the existing pathway network in Centennial Park. In response to a Request for Proposals, the landscape architectural firm of Ruhland & Associates was selected to undertake the design work for the pathway network.

The community will be consulted to solicit ideas/input and an Open House will be held in May 2023. Watch for details on the MCPRA website. If you have any questions contact the MCPRA **Project Lead:** Alexa Ives - aaives@rogers.com.

Tree Planting Hilltop Park

MCPRA is working with the Forestry Branch of the City of Ottawa and both Manotick Public School and St. Leonard's Catholic School to plant trees at Hilltop Park. Neighbours close to this area have also been consulted and are supportive of the planting.

Hilltop Park is a natural area running from Hilltop (pond area) to Long Island Drive. While many drive past thinking that this area is a vacant lot, it's actually a park! The intent is to plant small trees from the existing treed area toward Long Island Rd.

The City's Forestry Branch has put together a design that will have 200 small trees planted including hackberry, basswood, red oak, sugar maple, serviceberry, white pine, staghorn sumac and nannyberry. For design details, visit www.mcpra.org

West River Park (northwest corner of Bridge & West River) - the Duck Park

MCPRA cares for this park – putting down wood chips, keeping the site clean, and retaining the park in its natural state. This spring some native shrubs and plants will be planted including highbush cranberry, sumac, nannyberry, chokecherry, and native flowers – monarda, coneflower, asters, milkweed, and wild blue indigo.

Centennial Park Enhancement Project

This initiative, led by MCPRA, is an enhancement of the northeast corner of Centennial Park, including the skateboard, outdoor rink/basketball, and gateway areas, commemoratively named the *David Arntfield Recreation Area*. This is a \$1.2M+ project.

Phase 1: The Outdoor Rink and Basketball Courts

In July 2020, the <u>Final Design</u> for Phase 1, including a lit seasonal outdoor rink combined with basketball courts and related landscaping, was finalized.

Construction for Phase 1 got underway in late September 2020 and was completed in 2022. MCPRA worked in partnership with the City of Ottawa, Fotenn Planning + Design, McKee Electrical, and the Tomlinson Foundation.

Phase 2: The Skateboard Park, Pump Track and Gateway Area

Phase 2 is being led by the City of Ottawa, in collaboration with MCPRA. In January 2022, the City contracted the services of Fotenn Planning + Design to manage the project and design the areas beyond the skateboard portion, which was designed by New Line a company based in British Columbia, with offices in Toronto, Calgary, Florida and California.

The design was finalized in early November 2022 and tendered by the City on February 3, 2023. The tender closed on March 23.

The successful bid is committed to a late 2023 substantial completion so watch for progress this summer.

Project Funding

The Centennial Park Enhancement Project is being funded from multiple sources including the federal, provincial and municipal governments, private donations and local fundraising. These collective, in-kind and financial contributions have made this project feasible.

All donors will be recognized on site through a specially designed donor plaque.

Barney McCarney Landing

You may have been out walking and noticed the clear-cut area at the end of Van Vliet Road, known as Barney McCarney Landing. The City's Project Manager, Julie Lyons, indicated that this area had all vegetation removed in preparation for the Watermain Link that will be constructed this summer, running from David Bartlett Park, along Bravar, Long Island Rd. to Van Vliet where it will cross the River. "The tree clearing is required for the trenchless operation to take the watermain from one side of the river to the other. Due to the underground conditions, micro tunnelling is the preferred method, which requires a lot of space."

The City has confirmed that the area will be reinstated at the conclusion of the construction. You can see the planting plan, developed in consultation with the City's Forestry branch, on the City's website:
