


# Public Water Access Survey Results

# Introduction

The **Public Water Access Survey** was conducted from **September 14 to October 22, 2025**, and received a total of **180 responses** from Manotick residents and community members. The purpose of this survey was to gather community feedback to help guide improvements to local water access sites. This document presents the **aggregated results** of the survey. 
Question 1 - Do you or your household use public water access sites in Manotick? 180 responses






Question 2 - Which water access sites have you used?






Question 3 - How often do you use any of these public water access points? 180 responses




Question 4 - What activities do you usually undertake at these locations? 180 responses






Question 5 - Have you ever experienced any of the following at a public water access site?




Question 6 - Which of the following would improve your experience at public access sites? 180 responses






# Question 8 - What best describes you?

Question 9 - What is your age group?




